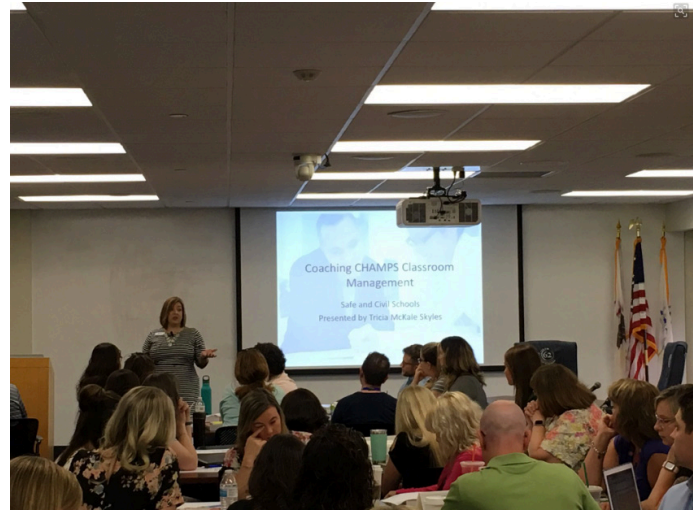

Superintendent Report

Superintendent Dr. Paul Hertel reflected on the end of the school year. He has spent time in the schools and acknowledged that there is still a lot of work being done, despite the fact that the 2018-2019 school year has ended. Assistant Superintendent for Student Services Dr. Ellen Swanson elaborated on the Extended School Year (ESY) programs for eligible special education students that began on June 10. ESY will conclude on July 11.

In addition, Dr. Swanson highlighted the positive outcomes from the two-day CHAMPS training that focused on supporting teachers to structure classroom environment for the purpose of engaging students. This will be a district initiative for next school year.



Dr. Hertel had the opportunity to attend the Bilingual Parent Advisory Council's Parent University last week. The two-week program will conclude with a visit to Medieval Times. Dr. Hertel was interviewed by Director for Second Language Learners' Programs Milagros Bravo in anticipation of his visit last week.

Dashboard Report

The Dashboard Report centered around the district's Workers Compensation data from 2013-2018. The district realized a 14% percent decrease in the adjusted 2020 premium. The decrease is the result of the district's low experience relative to the pool average and the favorable renewal rates for the pool as a whole.
