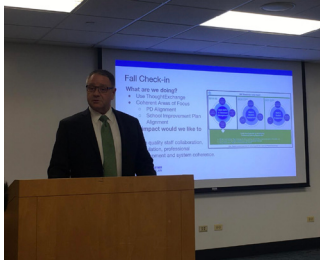

### Student Performance Monitoring

Assistant Superintendent for Instructional Services Dr. Laura Sangroula, Assistant Superintendent for Student Services Dr. Ellen Swanson and Director for Second Language Learners’ Programs Milagros Bravo provided an overview of District 62’s student performance in the following areas:

### Estimated Levy Resolution for 2019 Levy

The Board of Education adopted the 2019 tentative tax levy in the amount of \$76,001,000. This represents a 6.56% increase over the previous year. Taxpayers on existing properties will see an increase of approximately 1.9%, which is based on the Consumer Price Index. The 6.56% increase is intended to capture tax dollars from new construction. A public hearing will be held on December 16 prior to the Board voting on the final levy.
